James was born to Vernon Edward Fahey and Mary Fahey on May 5, 1924 in Woodbury, Iowa. There isn't a lot to report on James because he joined the Navy one month after his eighteenth birthday on June 7, 1942. After his training and a month on R-2 he was assigned on June 15, 1943 and became a member of the Corvina crew at commissioning on August 6, 1943.



Robert Wilmer Finske, RM3

Robert Wilmer Finske was born on June 14, 1922 to Wilmer and Mary Finske at St. Anthony's Hospital in Michigan City, Indiana. He continued to live in Michigan City for his young life, attending St. Mary's Catholic High School in Michigan City where, in his senior year was a founding member of the Oriflamme Society.

Robert Joined the Navy Reserve 16 days after his 20th birthday on 30 June 1942 and a year later, after basic training and school, he reported to USS Corvina on August 6, 1943 as an S2c. He was advanced to RM3 on board, September 2, 1943.

Enrico Bart Fiorot, TM3

Enrico was born to Italian immigrants on May 9, 1921 in Old Forge, Pennsylvania. His Mother was Rose "Rosie" Fiorot, who was widowed shortly after Enrico was born. When his father passed away, Enrico and his mother moved to Baltimore, Maryland, to live with his sister and Brother-in-law. He filled out his draft card in 1942 stating that he was employed at Rustless Iron and Steel works.

Enrico entered the Navy on July 10, 1942 and went to basic training and then schooling. By the time he reached the training submarine, R-2, he was already a TM3. He was transferred from R-2 on June 16, 1943 to Submarine Base New London for Duty aboard USS Corvina. He was listed as part of the commissioning crew on August 6, 1943
